# THE TIME OF MY LIFE!

Oh my goodness – what a tour –what a show!

Each time I say “this is the best ever” but I truly believe that *Ball And Boe Together At Christmas* has been the best so far.

As I recollect the last two or three weeks, I’m feeling mostly on top of the world with just a tinge of sadness at having to forgo my Nottingham and Cardiff tickets. I expect lots of people have felt the same, as this pesky virus doesn’t want to go away. I couldn’t forgive myself if I put my family at risk, especially with a new, long awaited baby due early in the New Year.

Even though I had to leave ‘The Party’ early, it was certainly on a mega high! I was still buzzing from the Manchester concert for a couple of days. I should begin by saying that Megan McKenna- known from appearing on *Celebrity Big Brother* and *The Only Way Is Essex*, performed for the first twenty five minutes entertaining us with songs that had a country vibe and some she had written herself. With an excellent voice, sparky presence and stunning dresses, Megan set the right mood for the main men.

From the moment the fantastic graphics lit up the stage, Callum and Murray and the amazing band and orchestra struck up the first notes, the atmosphere in the auditorium was electric and tangible. The

whole audience seemed to be on fire and just ready to enjoy themselves, as if we’d almost been let loose!

At last, the anticipation was over and Michael and Alfie burst out at the top of the stairs singing ‘Dancing in The Streets’ which got everyone in the mood to dance and party along with them. This was quickly followed by ‘Rocking All Over The World’ and although they’d only just begun the crowd went wild with enthusiasm.

Next came ‘The Greatest Show’ which in itself, was no lie and then ‘You’ll Be Back’ ( of course we will!) After the clapping and cheering had subsided, Michael paid tribute to Stephen Sondheim saying what a truly sad loss of a unique and amazing talent. Michael and Alfie then chose to sit on the stairs and sing a tender and moving ‘Not While I’m Around’ from *Sweeney Todd*- a great musical in which, of course, Michael played the principal role.

In a similar emotional mode they sang my personal favourite ‘The Rose’. I will never get tired of listening to this song. It surely is the most gorgeous of all. Again, the tone was thought provoking with a beautiful rendition of ‘Wishing’ (You Were Somehow Here Again) from *Phantom Of The Opera* and ‘A Thousand Years’, a lovely Christina Perri song. Staying in this more serious vein, we were treated to a meaningful and sincere version of ‘Army’

and then came the *Les Misérables* section when Michael sang ‘Stars’ and Alfie ‘Bring Him Home’. It was no surprise that the audience rose to their feet hearing these and erupted at an outstanding ‘One Day More’.

The tempo became more upbeat with other favourites ‘ The Circle of Life’ from *The Lion King*, ‘He Lives In You’ and ‘You’re The Voice’ by John Farnham.

The moment arrived for Michael to introduce ‘Love Changes’ saying he had sung it in every concert that he’d ever performed in and this was to be no exception. This time it would be slightly different because Alfie, although stating he didn’t want to, would be singing it with him! This was the time to sway, join in, get the torches out. Looking around the huge arena, this was quite a spectacle and very special.

The fabulous show continued with ‘The Queen Medley’ starting with ‘A Kind Of Magic’ and continuing with ‘Radio Ga Ga,’ ‘We Will Rock You’ and ‘We Are The Champions’. By this point Michael and Alfie had the crowd in the palms of their hands. Everyone was just loving what they were seeing and hearing and didn’t need any encouragement to ‘rock’!

‘The Blues Brothers Medley’ quickly followed, when Megan appeared with ‘The Boys’ for ‘Everybody Needs Somebody To Love’, ‘Soul Man’, ‘Shake Your Tail Feather’ and I think, if I remember correctly, ‘Gimme Some Lovin’. This part of the show took me back to when Michael did a concert in Amsterdam and Callum had to don ‘the hat and glasses’. What a fab, fun and memorable trip that was!

This all went down a storm before a short interlude leading into ‘It’s Beginning To Look A Lot Like Christmas’ and ‘I’ll Be Home For Christmas’ accompanied again by fantastic graphics which really put us all in the Christmas spirit and festive mood. Michael said that Alfie had introduced him to Ray Charles’s ‘The Spirit of Christmas’, a lovely song they sang together beautifully.

Megan joined them once more for ‘Baby Please Come Home’ and ‘All I Want For Christmas Is You’ when there was quite a



bit of bantering over who she *really* wanted for Christmas! 'Merry Christmas Everyone' brought the audience to their feet once more, dancing, singing, stamping their feet and generally going wild (No... that wasn't just me Ha Ha!)

Eventually, The Dynamic Duo reappeared with yet more 70's Christmas classics and ending with 'I Wish It Could Be Christmas Every Day' which brought an explosion of tumultuous appreciation from the audience almost raising the rafters of the huge arena. This was such a 'feel good' concert with something for everyone which I think we all needed!

I'm sure I've missed bits out – immediately remembering Alfie's cartwheel during The Blues Brothers segment... and Michael at one point producing mistletoe from his top pocket and planting a smacker on Alfie who, I hasten to add, very quickly put his mask on. So funny!

From Birmingham to Manchester this tour was a total blast – full of fun and friends and train journeys to remember. Trains were cancelled for all sorts of reasons from signal faults to a seagull smashing a window. The best or worst (as to how you look at it?) was being turfed off the Brighton to Bournemouth train because of an unexploded WW2 bomb at Fareham! Well we discovered all trains go through Fareham so no way we could get

to Southampton for our connection. We did, however, get the Portsmouth train to Chichester where Rose's friends very kindly drove us to Southampton. The show was brilliant and worth all the trials and tribulations, including a fairly rocky flight home due to Storm Arwen.

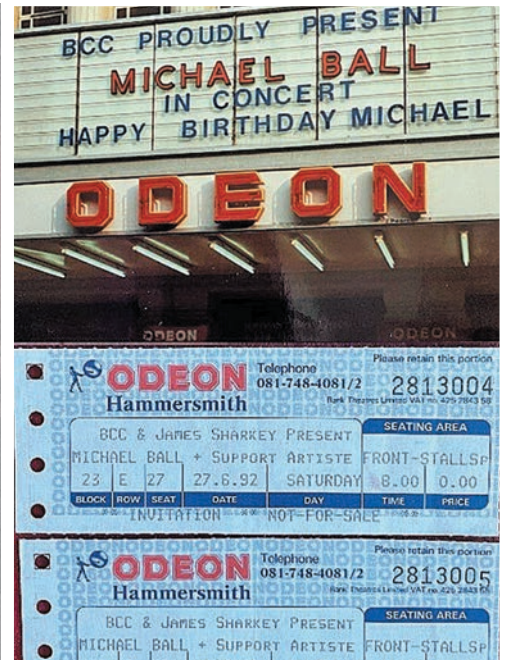

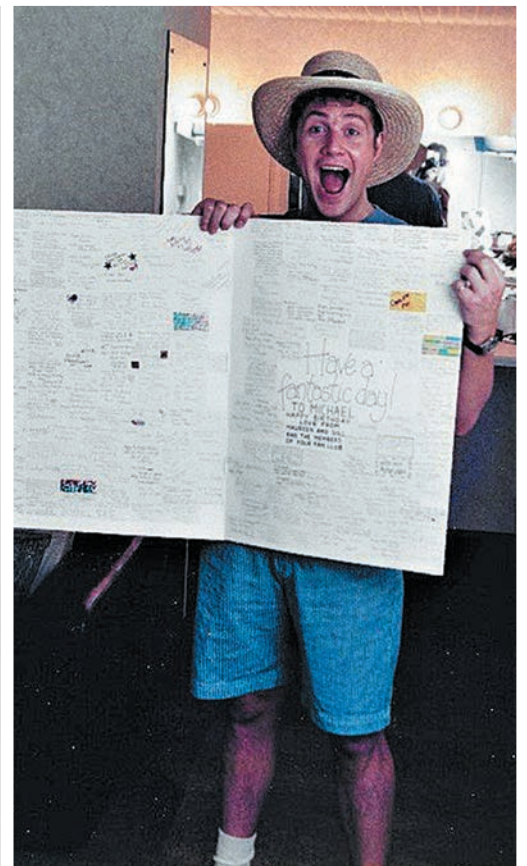




# THIRTY YEAR THROWBACK

We went back to the concert. I liked the concert but I was very tired. After we got a taxi, which was green, back to the hotel. I had a good day!

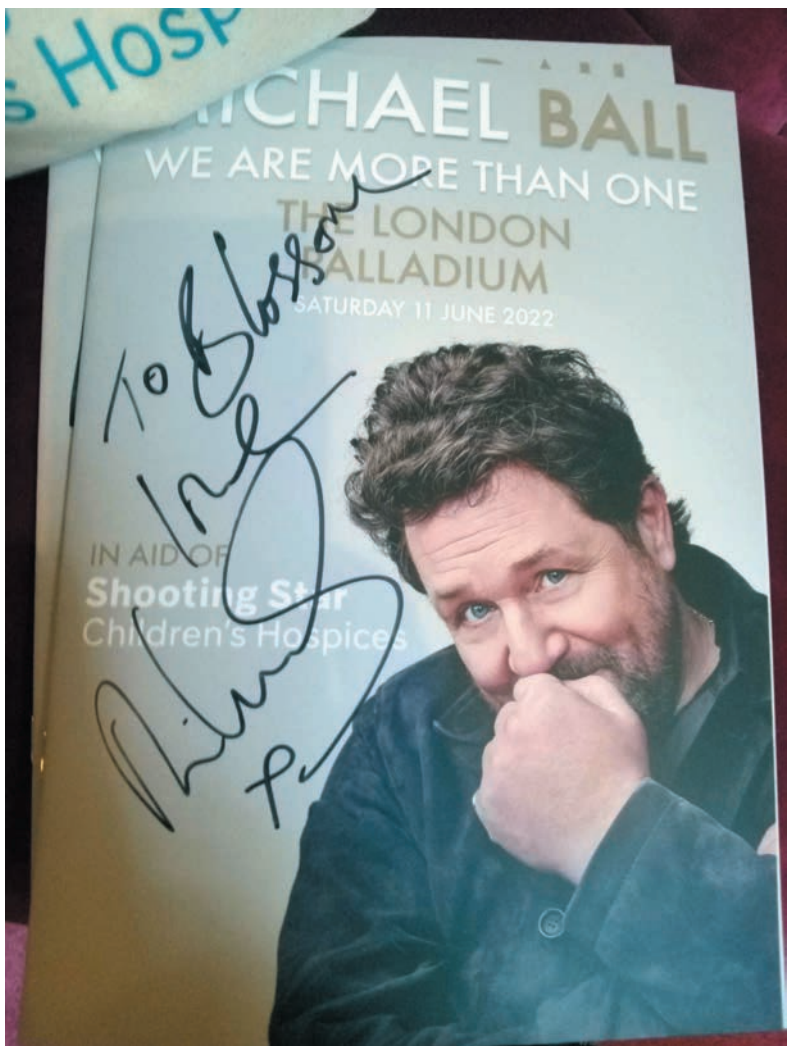


10. What age did you first perform on stage and what can you remember about it.

I was only with her about 15 minutes but I was smiling all the time because she was so happy. Helen thanked me and said that when I left Margaret cried as she was so happy.

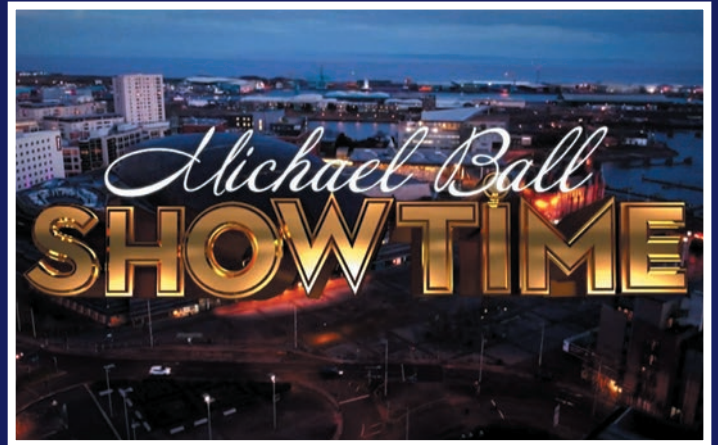

A trip to England for a concert? Have I lost my mind? Flying after more than a 20 year absence? Have I lost my mind? Yes to all four of those questions, but there's a good reason.

After surviving two bouts of cancer with all its treatment woes and the sudden passing of a close friend, I decided to throw off the shackles of fear and start ticking off my bucket list. When I heard that Michael and Alfie were doing a summer concert tour, I knew that I had to go. The Hampton Court event was scheduled for my birthday. It must have been a sign and what better gift could I give myself?

The last time I flew, a travel agent was involved. No on-line bookings or check-ins; no contact forms to fill out or Covid tests to book (thankfully that requirement was lifted). For a retired civil

servant who still believes in paper, this was going to be a real test. Thanks to the incredible generosity of Tracy Taylor-Scott, a ticket was procured and the impetus to go got stronger. Deciding that "if you don't climb the mountain, you never see the view," I arranged lodging and flights via this new-fangled thing called an "app"!

I've wanted to see Michael perform live since I "found" him three years ago. The stars aligned, my courage up (shakily), off I flew. I was at Alfie's Las Vegas show - fabulous by the way and close to home - but after seeing all the videos of the two of them, I just had to experience it live.

Nothing, I mean nothing, prepares you for a live concert. The anticipation at the palace was palpable as the crowd began filing in. I sat and took it all in - the lighting crew, the sound crew, even





the stage crew diligently sweeping the stage wearing booties. As the time grew nearer, I could hardly keep my seat, “The show will begin in ten minutes, ladies and gentlemen.” Then five minutes...

As the strains of the theme from *2001 - A Space Odyssey* filled the air - there they were, arriving on stage to thunderous applause and cheers. Watching Michael standing there so proud, so happy to be performing with his mate again, has to be seen to be believed.

The show was tight and well-run – old favorites from *Les Mis*, ‘The Prayer,’ ‘The Rose’. Las Vegas was in the house as were

Queen, the Four Seasons, and a lovely rendition of ‘The Gambler.’

To illustrate the power of their combined talents - there was a couple in front of me who were celebrating the wife’s birthday. The husband had mistakenly bought tickets to the concert thinking they were for Michael Bublé! The wife mentioned that she wasn’t that big a fan of our Michael, but knew ‘Aspects of Love’ and ‘Love Changes Everything.’ I listed some of Michael’s accomplishments and said, “Just wait.” After they sang ‘A Thousand Years,’ she burst into tears, turned around and said, “Now I understand.” She was on her feet the rest of the night.

It seemed that the crowd was on their feet during the entire concert - a first for me but you just couldn’t stay seated - especially during ‘Reach.’ As for me, despite a deluge during the Tom Jones set (Jane Cornish, you really got a drenching!), near mishaps with moths, and a cut on Alfie’s finger, the 10,000 mile trip was so totally worth it. Thanks again to the generous heart and encouragement of Tracy Taylor-Scott, I did, indeed lose my mind. It was a dream come true and I will never forget the excitement, the satisfaction, the pure joy at that performance, and the kindred spirits I met.

I became a Michael Ball fan around mid 2003 when he was appearing in *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang*. I already knew about him from hearing 'Love Changes Everything' on a TV show in 1992 (I think it was *Entertainment Tonight*). I had to know who sang that song so I went to my local CD store and looked up the song title in that big catalogue that they used to have on the front desks (it's all computerized now). There were several artists listed so I went to the Musical Theater section and picked out a compilation disc of Andrew Lloyd Webber's musical theater songs. I played Michael's version of LCE and it really did change everything.

When I got my first computer in 1996, I started doing research to find out who is that guy with the amazing voice and the rest is history. I didn't intend to but as the years went by, I collected CD's and DVD's of Michael's shows, TV appearances, radio shows, fan photos, anything related

to Michael, mostly from UK fans in his Fan Club. I first saw him perform in 2004 in Salt Lake City and then I traveled to the UK for his concerts, stage shows and musicals.

Over the years, my collection got to be quite out of hand so I began cataloging the CD/DVD's into yearly 3 ring binders with 8 discs to a page. At last count, I had







244 pages.....that's about 1,952 discs with new ones added as I transfer photos and videos to discs for safe keeping (along with an external hard drive, just in case). Then add in all the *On The Ball* magazines and concert/theater programs and wow, my "never intended to" Michael library has become much larger than I ever expected.

It's fun to pull out a disc from any particular year and relive the moments in Michael's career. And, I intend to keep adding. 'Don't Stop Me Now' seems to be my theme song!

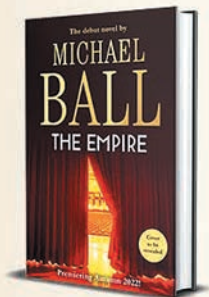


# Michael & Alfie in Scarborough
