I personally thought that was a great analogy.

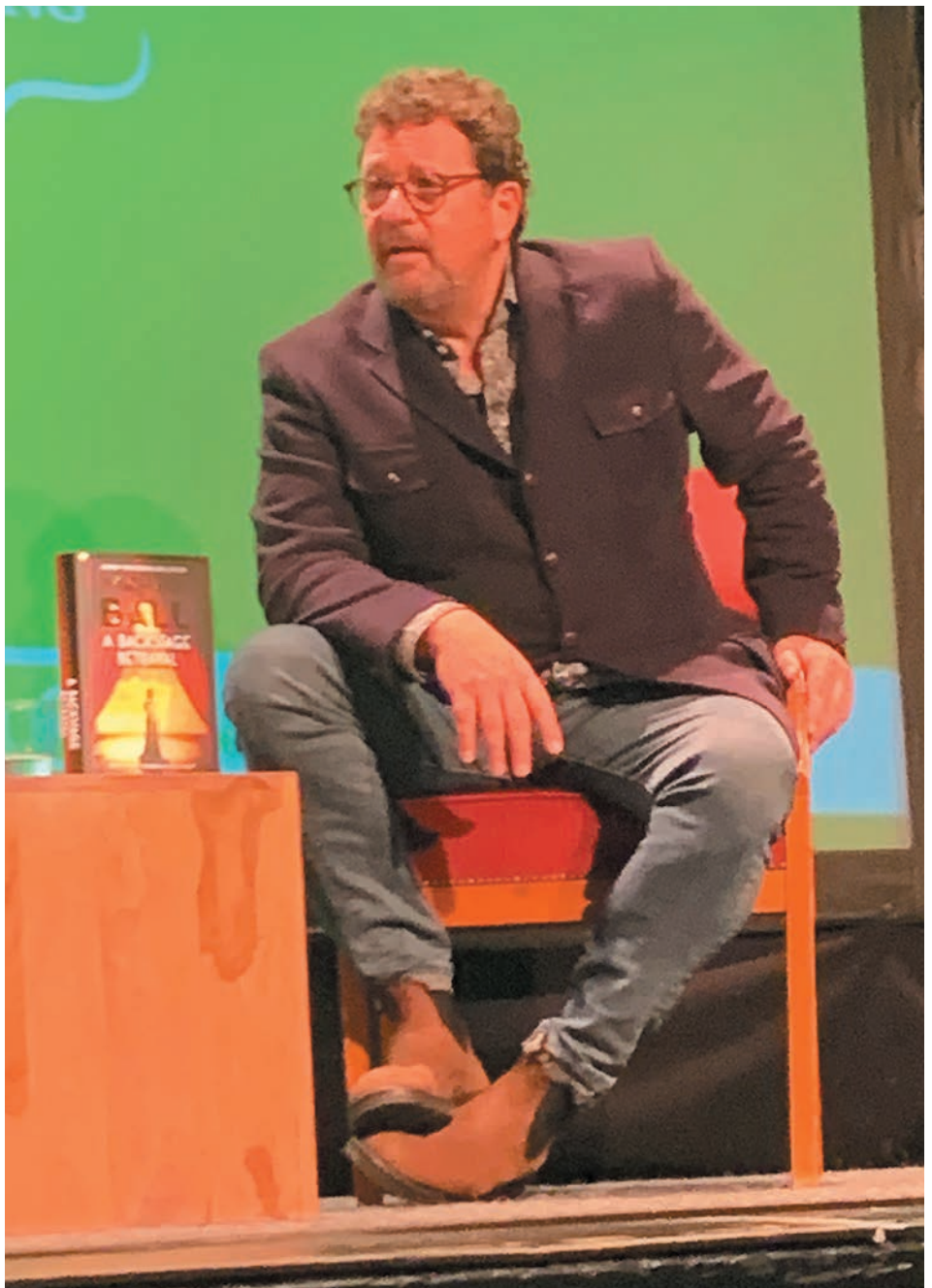

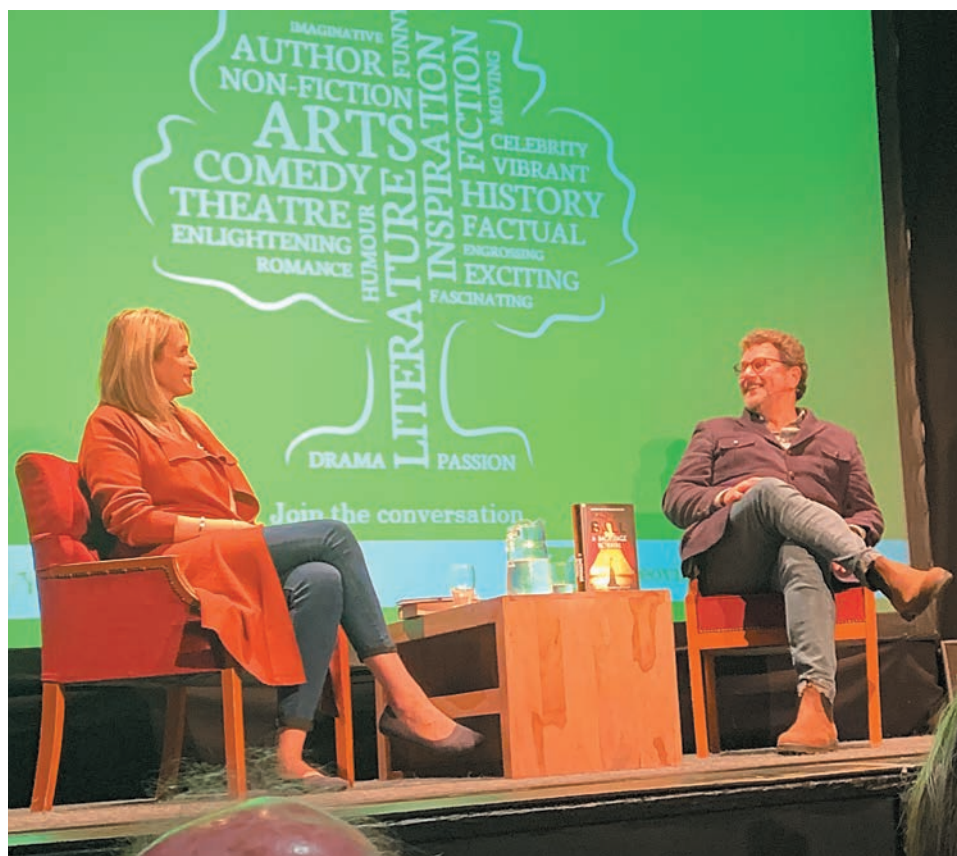
As a lady had before me had asked the question which I was going to ask,

All the time I was talking he held his hands together in front of him and had this wonderful expression of listening to everything I was saying. He had walked from the back of the cricket field, through the edge of the crowd, then passed where we were patiently waiting. Michael waved as he climbed the steps again before appearing front stage to a tumultuous welcome.

Oh my goodness, he was totally on top form and gave us a fabulous concert! I'm not about to list all the songs he sang as they were mostly from his latest tour's setlist, such as 'Coming Home To You', 'Tennessee Dreams', 'The Gambler', 'The Song We Will Remember', 'Anthem', 'Stars', 'The Rose', 'I Just Can't Help Believing', 'I'll Never Fall In Love Again' etc. and of course finishing with 'One Step Out Of Time' and 'You Can't Stop The Beat'.

True to form, Michael always makes his concerts fresh and new whilst entertaining his audience with his stories and banter. He teased about the weather, reminiscing about another Yorkshire outdoor concert at Scarborough, when it never gave up

Michael Ball and Alfie Boe have had a successful partnership, with five top 5 albums, three number 1's, two Classic Brit Awards, and three sold-out arena tours. Now with the release of their latest record, 'Together At Home', they've managed to secure their fourth number 1 album!

'Together At Home' features a selection

of beloved homegrown songs, including hits like 'Proud,' 'Rule The World,' and 'Welcome Home' and it has been extremely well received.

"I can't believe it, our fourth Number 1 album!" Michael said, reacting to the news. "Alfie Boe, I bloody love you! I want to say thank you to everyone who's

worked so hard to make this happen. Most importantly, I want to thank all the fans who've gone out and bought it and have loved it. That's why we do what we do – we do it for you!

"This is an extraordinary bit of icing on the cake – I couldn't be happier. It's incredibly special."

Meanwhile, Alfie, in his usual understated style, reacted by saying "We're Number 1, I'm absolutely thrilled! Thank you to everybody that's got us here, I couldn't wish for better. I'm going to celebrate with fish and chips after this, I'm pushing the boat out!"

AMAZING GRACE



Michael was keenly supporting his step-granddaughter Grace Crompton earlier, as she was representing Team GB in Rugby Sevens at the Paris Olympics. Grace has only been playing rugby for four years, but she has already announced herself on the world stage.

The winger scored six tries on her debut for GB Sevens when they won gold at the Women’s Fast Four in Vancouver. Grace was then awarded an England central contract for Sevens Rugby before making her England U20s debut in March. She combines her rugby with a degree in sport management & coaching.

“He always tells me that he never thought he would be cheering on women’s Rugby Sevens, but here he is now,” Grace said. “He watches every stop on the series with my grandma. They put on the live stream with a glass of wine in hand and watch all day.”

“They are the biggest supporters ever, and I guess he’s great at what he does as well. I will never say no to a bit of Les Mis on the team bus!”



Cameron Mackintosh's production of Boublil and Schönberg's *LES MISÉRABLES: THE ARENA SPECTACULAR* hit the road as part of a World Tour performing in over 15 countries and regions worldwide. As the beloved musical phenomenon enters its 40th revolutionary year in London, this spectacular production has an extraordinary new design specifically created for larger venues.

The show features Michael as Javert and Alfie Boe as Jean Valjean at selected performances, with Bradley Jaden and Killian Donnelly taking over those roles in the shows Michael and Alfie are not booked for. Other notable cast members include Bonnie Langford and Matt Lucas.

The Arena Spectacular has been touring the UK, with Luxembourg, Switzerland, Italy, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, The Netherlands, Australia, Japan and China to follow, with more worldwide destinations to be announced. Michael and Alfie have announced they will both perform at the Australian dates next year.

The first time I got in contact with the music of *Les Misérables* was in the 1990s, when I had a copy of the German cast recording on a tape. I loved it back then, but the tape got lost over the years and I didn't think of it anymore until I stumbled across Michael many years later. There it was again. The love for the music hadn't changed.

I started to watch the recordings of the anniversary shows and, again years later, finally managed to see the musical in the West End, wondering why it had taken me so long. When the arena tour was announced, I briefly thought that it would be nice to see it, but the venues were far away, so I didn't bother trying. Things changed when the cast was announced. A chance to see both Michael and Alfie in it – live – couldn't be missed. I successfully convinced my partner, who's not too keen on musicals, to consider a trip to the UK. First win! Next problem - the date of the show had to be during some school holidays, so that the whole family could go. The first two possible venues sold out faster than I could clarify any holiday options. Maybe it wasn't meant to be.

Months later it somehow dawned on

me that the first Aberdeen dates also fit into our autumn holidays. I checked and... there were tickets left! In addition to the tickets I found an affordable flight, so there was nothing more to think about. Off we went for a wonderful week in Edinburgh and Aberdeen!

When we arrived in Scotland, I informed the family that I had bought three tickets for *Les Mis*. My partner had guessed so, my daughter was not impressed at all. Why this musical again, as I had already seen it a couple of times? And why did she have to come along? Reluctantly the girl joined in, knowing that she had no other choice! The bus transfer from the city to the P&J live arena was perfect. When there, our madame discovered the cast list, stating Michael and Alfie were starring in it. Now it dawned on her. Mum, Michael and this other guy... In order to survive the show, a huge box of popcorn had to be bought and we went to our seats. The music started and our teen sat there, listening, watching, not uttering even the tiniest of complaints. During the interval there was a sudden interest in the merch stand. She bought a bag and a CD. Maybe the show wasn't that bad after all!

I loved everything. The cast was brilliant, I especially enjoyed the guys who played Enjolras and Marius (besides Michael and Alfie, of course). I was more than happy to finally see Michael as Javert in a live concert. He (and Alfie) were perfect. I had seen the DVD of the Staged Concert again and again, but nothing recorded comes up to any live performance. Besides the singing, I – just as in *Aspects Of Love* last year - marvelled at Michael's acting skills. His facial expressions, sometimes just minimalistic ones, transferred very well Javert's thoughts and feelings. Simply perfection. Time flew by and everything was over way too fast. Cameron Mackintosh and his team have staged another awesome version of this great musical and have again succeeded in casting so many talented people. The show was worth every penny, time and travel efforts.

And for the final success: our teen loved the show and *Les Mis* has a new fan. I do not need to put the music on, it's already playing when I come home. Plus – Michael got extra credit for having been the performer with the best diction (the only one our girl could understand completely). What more could I ask for?
