West End star Ball said: “If she works hard and hones her craft she has got a chance of doing really well. She has something really interesting and quirky about her, a beautiful voice and she has got class. She has a really bright future.”

Miss McShane, from Chiswick, is a media student at Goldsmiths University. She plans to use the prize to buy a mandolin to add to her collection of instruments.

She said: “I’m so stunned. It is so flattering, especially to hear praise from someone like Michael Ball who is a true musician. That’s why I appreciate this competition because the judges are



respected in their crafts. It means a lot.

“I think I’ll use the money to have an amazing summer and I want a new mandolin. I also play the violin, guitar and harmonica.”

The talent competition was organised by cocktail bar Archer Street in Soho,

where many of the bar staff are also performers.

Sixty-four contestants battled it out over eight weeks to make it to the final, judged by Ball, fellow West End star Brenda Edwards, X Factor creative director Tim Gething and BBC producer Mike Hanson.
