
Until then I send you the triggest of hugs and the hope for the happiest of Christmasses and New Year.

### WHEN MICHAEL MET KIMBER!

On Saturday 8th August, my daughter Nicola and I went to see *Mack and Mabel* at Chichester.

The matinee was an audio described performance, which means that people who are visually impaired can wear headphones during the show and a person describes what is happening on the stage.

Before the performance the theatre sends out a CD which describes the stage setting, costumes, the characters, etc., and sometimes the theatre puts on a touch tour before the performance. Chichester is very good at arranging AD performances and we

were very lucky that they had also arranged a touch tour.

Some members of the production team, wardrobe staff, wig supervisor and sometimes some of the cast then join the VIPs and talk to them and show them round and let them feel some of the props, costumes and sometimes go on the stage and feel the set, which is absolutely brilliant. This all makes the show so much more enjoyable.

We were waiting outside hoping to see Michael arrive and were chatting to other fans in the sunshine but we had to go at

1:45pm for the touch tour and so missed him arriving. We were lucky to be joined by quite a few cast members including Jack Edwards and some of the ensemble. However what a wonderful surprise when suddenly Michael appeared with a big Hello! Nicola is blind and had her guide dog Kimber with her as well. He spoke to everyone, including Kimber, and then went on to describe different bits of the show. The photo below was taken when he was telling everyone about his big projector. It was lovely to be up so close and he spent a good fifteen minutes with us all. We all appreciated that so much, knowing what a busy day he had ahead with two shows and he also did the radio interview after the show that night!

We then went in to watch the show, which was absolutely fantastic. When we went to collect Kimber, who had been left in the wonderful care of the cloakroom staff, we were told that Michael had paid him a visit on one of his journeys through the foyer and even remembered his name!

We have had AD performances for *Hairspray* and *Sweeney Todd* but this one was really special as Michael came to the touch tour. We enjoyed it so much we have booked for the AD performance in Cardiff in December. Hopefully there will be a touch tour and Michael will visit again!





While Mack and Mabel was running in Chichester, a review was written in the Chichester Observer by Phil Hewitt. Here's what he had to say:

The tale, based in truth, is the story of the ill-fated love shared, but not really enjoyed, by legendary Hollywood filmmaker Mack Sennett and his even more ill-fated star. Mabel Normand.

Just as he was always going to be, Michael Ball is immense as Mack, giving a superb performance as the guy who knows how to bully and probably knows how to love, but is absolutely hopeless at expressing it. Ball gives us Mack the tyrant, the man who blazes a trail but can't make the transition to the new craze for talkies. At times, he is furious, at times almost grudgingly tender. Always he is superb.

But the night's revelation is US newcomer Rebecca LaChance. Yes, Mabel shows spirit, and presumably that's the point, but you get the feeling in the wrong hands it could be a rather colourless role.



It's certainly not with LaChance, who is simply lovely in the part, oozing decency, niceness and vulnerability. 'Look What Happened to Mabel' seems the highlight for so long for its sheer business – but for sheer beauty, her second-half 'Time Heals

Everything' tops the lot. Wonderful stuff in a production which is wonderful in every other respect, from the big numbers to the small, from the projections to the dancing. Warm, funny and very, very affecting.

Another standing ovation at the end, and even though Michael had

said he would be going straight home after the show, he still came out and signed autographs and had photos with the fans that had missed him earlier.

Then it was back to the hotel and home the next day, to wait for the tour. It seemed like an age as I wasn't going to see it again till October 22nd matinee, in Manchester with my good friend Rita McLaren and her friend Jan. We managed to get to the stage door before Michael had arrived so were really happy when he walked around the corner. As usual he had time for everyone, signing autographs and having photos taken and made a point of going over to Alana (in her wheelchair) and having a lovely photo taken with her. It was quite a different experience with it being on a normal stage instead of the thrust stage at Chichester, but we soon got used to it. A wonderful show again and poor Lottie's custard pie in the face was thrown with quite a bit of force and seemed to knock her head back! A standing ovation as is the norm and then it was back to the station to catch the train home. A wonderful wonderful show which richly deserves a transfer to the West End, fingers crossed everyone.



P.S. We shall even forgive him trying to run off with Blossom before the show!








