PAST & PRESENT: CELEBRATING 28 YEARS OF THE MICHAEL BALL FAN CLUB (part 2)

As we explained in *On The Ball* 77, we intended having a whole colection of *Hairspray* coverage, among other things, to cover this time – sadly Covid-19 caused all the various tours and shows to be cancelled or postponed. Instead, as the Fan Club has turned 28 years old, last issue we decided to include some stories from different fans about their Michael experiences. This issue compiles part two of various members sharing their recollections... and in keeping with the theme, this year's calendar also using images from all different eras of Michael's career.

To kick things off, Mark Witchell came up with the wonderful idea of bringing 2020 to a close by looking back at the last decade. Over to you, Mark!

As we entered the start of a new decade at the start of the year I thought it would be great to look back at what Michael has done over the last ten years!

2010

- 2010 was another busy year for Michael. He performed as Edna Turnblad in the *Hairspray* UK tour visiting Cardiff, Glasgow, Southampton, Manchester, Dublin and Edinburgh.
- Michael recorded his third TV series for ITV - this time a chat show format.
- Michael performed in two summer outdoor concerts at Hampton Court and Killruddery House in Ireland.
- Throughout the year Michael continued to host his weekly Sunday morning show for BBC Radio 2, Sunday Brunch.
- October was a busy month which involved his second Shooting Stars Charity Concert at London's Prince of



Wales Theatre. He also performed in the finale of the 25th Anniversary concert of *Les Misérables* at London's O2 Arena.

• In November he released his latest DVD *A Life on Stage* with various TV and Radio appearances to promote this.

2011

- 2011 started with Michael completing the *Hairspray* UK tour at Wimbledon and Bristol.
- In March Michael hosted the Olivier Awards at Theatre Royal Drury Lane with Imelda Staunton. March saw the release of Michael's latest album *Heroes* and there were various TV and Radio appearances to promote this.
- In May and June Michael toured the UK and Ireland with *Heroes Live* starting at Dublin's Grand Canal Theatre and finishing at the



Canal Theatre and finishing at the Brighton Centre. There

were also two sold out concerts at London's Royal Albert Hall. The two concerts at Birmingham's Symphony Hall were filmed for DVD release later in the year in November.

- Throughout the year Michael continued to host his weekly Sunday morning BBC Radio 2 show *Sunday Brunch*.
- Michael ended the year by starring in *Sweeney Todd* from September through to November at the Chichester Festival Theatre with Imelda Staunton.

2012

• 2012 was mainly about *Sweeney Todd* as it transferred to the Adelphi Theatre in London and ran from March through to September.



- Michael once again hosted the Olivier Awards with Imelda Staunton at the Theatre Royal Drury Lane in April. Michael also performed in West End Eurovision with the cast of *Sweeney Todd* at London's Dominion Theatre.
- Michael closed the year with two very special concerts at the Cork Opera House in December with the Cork Youth Orchestra.

2013

- Michael started 2013 by launching his brand new Sunday evening BBC Radio 2 show Sunday Night with Michael Ball.
- In February Michael released his latest solo album *Both Sides Now* and there were various TV and Radio appearances to promote this. *Both Sides Now* turned Gold in April.

In March Michael hosted a very




special programme for ITV celebrating the music of Andrew Lloyd Webber.

- In April Michael launched his latest UK tour starting at the Regent Theatre in Ipswich and ending in May at the Guildhall in Portsmouth. Michael's concert at London's Hammersmith Apollo was filmed for DVD release later in the year.
- In April Michael won the Olivier Award for his role in *Sweeney Todd* and collected it at London's Royal Opera House.



- August saw Michael perform an open air concert at Audley End. Michael also stepped in to host the Ken Bruce Show for BBC Radio 2.
- Michael was lucky enough to perform his *Both Sides Now* concert for two very special nights in Abu Dhabi in August.
- September saw Michael perform a special 'Live by the Lake' Open air concert at Kenwood House in London celebrating the music of George Gershwin.
- In October Michael performed in *Don Black: A Life in Song* at London's Royal Festival Theatre which was broadcast on BBC 4 at Christmas.
- Via video link Michael performed the role of 'God' in *Spamalot* at the Playhouse Theatre for a week in October.
- Michael flew to Shanghai in November and December to perform in a special concert entitled *Do You Hear The People Sing?* celebrating the world of Boublil and Schonberg.
- Michael then returned to London for a special Shooting Stars charity concert in December at London's Phoenix



Theatre. Michael performed in the Royal Theatrical Funds Christmas Carol Concert at Putney. He then finished the year by performing on board a P&O Cruise Ship. 2014 saw Michael start the year by returning to work with Imelda Staunton in Victoria Wood's new TV Musical *That Day We Sang* which was broadcast on the BBC at Christmas.



- Michael continued to host his Sunday evening show for BBC Radio 2 Sunday Night with Michael Ball.
- In March Michael performed in another *Do You Hear The People Sing?* concert this time in Taipei, Taiwan.
- In May Michael returned to the Cork Opera House for two special concerts with the Cork Youth Orchestra on the theme of 'A Night at the Movies'.
- In August Michael headlined the Lytham Proms for the first time with Lesley Garrett and the Halle Orchestra.
- In September Michael performed with his band in a special *A Night of Variety* concert at the Alhambra Theatre in Bradford.
- Later that month he performed in *West End Heroes* at the Dominion Theatre in London.
- In August and October Michael once again stepped in to host for Ken Bruce on BBC Radio 2.
- November saw the release of Michael's latest solo album *If Everyone was Listening* and there were various TV and Radio appearances to promote this.
- December saw Michael once again perform in the Royal Theatrical Fund's Christmas Carol concert in Putney.



2015

• 2015 started with Michael appearing on ITV's new prime time celebrity talent show *Get Your Act Together* in which he reached the Grand Final with James Bolam.



- Michael continued to host his weekly BBC Radio 2 Sunday evening show throughout the year.
- In March Michael headed to Rome to host some singing Master Classes.
- In April and May Michael headed on his latest UK solo tour starting at the Bournemouth BIC and finishing at the Mayflower Theatre in Southampton. The big London date was in April at the Hammersmith Apollo.
- In June Michael received an OBE for services to Musical Theatre in the Queen's Birthday Honours List.
- Later in 2015 Michael starred in a revival of *Mack And Mabel* playing the part of Mack Sennett from July to September at the Chichester Festival Theatre.



- The production then went on a UK tour playing in Plymouth, Manchester, Dublin, Edinburgh, Nottingham and Cardiff.
- In December Michael once again performed in the Royal Theatrical Fund's Christmas Carol Concert in Putney. Michael ended the year performing at London's Hammersmith Apollo in a tribute concert to Frank Sinatra.

2016

- 2016 was an extremely busy year for Michael. From January through to April Michael continued to host his weekly Sunday evening show for BBC Radio 2 *Sunday Night with Michael Ball*.
- Following the death of Terry Wogan, Michael was chosen to take over the Sunday morning BBC Radio 2 slot and from April Michael's new show launched *The Michael Ball Show*.
- In February, March and April Michael also sat in once again for Ken Bruce on BBC Radio 2.
- Michael performed in *The Oliviers In Concert* at the Royal Festival Theatre in London which was broadcast live on BBC Radio 3.
- In January Michael performed his first solo concert at the Hippodrome Casino in London. This was repeated in July. Michael also collected his well deserved OBE from Buckingham Palace in January.



- In April Michael hosted the Olivier Awards at London's Royal Opera House.
- In September Michael hosted *BBC Proms In The Park* for the first time at Hyde Park in London.
- 2016 also saw the beginning of a successful partnership with his old friend Alfie Boe. The pair released their first album *Together* in October which went to Number 1 and received a Double Platinum disc award. They also filmed their first TV special for ITV. They completed



the year by performing an extensive UK tour starting at the Motorpoint Arena in Cardiff and finishing at the Blackpool Opera House. Dates also included two nights at the London Palladium and the Hammersmith Apollo.

2017

- 2017 saw Michael continue to host his weekly Sunday morning BBC Radio 2 show *The Michael Ball Show*.
- In January Michael returned to the Hippodrome Casino in London for another sell out concert.
- In May Michael and Alfie performed their *Together* concert in New York City.
- In June Michael and Alfie performed an Open Air concert series playing in Eastnor Castle in Gloucester, Walcot Hall in Wolverhampton, Stanstead Park in Portsmouth, Hampton Court, Euston Hall in Thetford, Lincoln Castle in Doncaster, the Scarborough Open Air Theatre and the Greenwich Music Time Festival.
- In September Michael once again hosted the BBC *Proms In The Park* at Hyde Park in London.
- In October Michael and Alfie flew to Australia to perform their *Together* concerts at Brisbane, Melbourne, Sydney, Perth and Adelaide.
- That same month, Michael and Alfie's second album *Together Again* was released, resulting in a second Number 1 album.
- The pair also filmed a second TV special for ITV.



- In November Michael and Alfie performed and headlined the *Royal Variety Performance* at the London Palladium.
- Michael and Alfie ended the year with a sell out UK Arena tour starting at the Motorpoint Arena in Cardiff and finishing at London's O2 Arena. The concert from Glasgow's Hydro Arena was recorded for transmission at Christmas on BBC Radio 2. The pair also released a charity single of *Bring Me Sunshine* for the Rays of Sunshine Children's Charity.



- 2018 saw Michael continue to host his weekly BBC Radio 2 Sunday morning show *The Michael Ball Show*.
- In February Michael and Alfie headed to Japan for three sell out *Together Again* concerts.
- In April, May and June Michael made his West End return in *Chess*, starring as Anatoly at London's Coliseum.
- In June Michael and Alfie picked up two Classical BRIT Awards at the Royal Albert Hall in London.
- In July Michael was special guest on Il Divo's Summer Open Air Concert

Tour playing at Euston Hall in Thetford, Englefield House in Reading, Ragley Hall in Warwickshire, Alnwick Castle, Stansted Park in Chichester and Belvoir Castle in Grantham.

- In August Michael and Alfie performed at the CarFest South Event for BBC *Children In Need*.
- In September Michael once again hosted BBC *Proms In The Park* in Hyde Park.
- In October Michael performed on the first *Musical Theatre Stages Cruise* joining the ship at Amsterdam.
- In November Michael hosted his BBC Radio 2 show live from the Savoy Theatre in London for BBC *Children In Need*.

2019

- 2019 continued to see Michael's weekly BBC Radio 2 Sunday morning show *The Michael Ball Show* bring in record listeners.
- March saw the release of Michael's first solo album for four years *Coming Home To You* which reached Number One in the UK album charts.



• In April and May Michael performed a UK Solo tour starting at the Nottingham Royal Concert Hall and finishing at the De

Montfort Hall in Leicester. Michael performed two sell out nights at the London Palladium.

- In May Michael performed a duet of 'A Million Dreams' with Susan Boyle for her new album '*TEN*'. The pair then performed this during the *Britain's Got Talent* Live Final on ITV at London's Hammersmith Apollo in June.
- In June Michael returned to partner Alfie Boe to perform a Summer Open Air concert at Hampton Court Palace Music Festival. In July Michael headlined the Lytham Proms for the second time, on this occasion with Sheridan Smith.
- In September Michael once again hosted BBC *Proms In The Park* from Hyde Park for BBC Radio 2.
- In November Michael hosted his BBC Radio 2 Sunday morning show from London's Savoy Theatre for BBC *Children In Need*.
- From August to December Michael returned to the West End

to perform in a Staged Concert version of *Les Misérables* at the Gielgud Theatre in London playing the role of Javert alongside Alfie Boe. The performance was filmed for cinemas and DVD/CD release in 2020. The production was also broadcast on BBC Radio 2 in January 2020.



• In November Michael and Alfie released their third album *Back Together* which also resulted in a third TV special for ITV at Christmas.

2020

- 2020 was another busy year. In February and March, Ball & Boe performed a ten date UK Arena Tour finishing at the O2 Arena in London. The O2 Arena concert was filmed for cinema release in October and subsequently the *Back Together Live Tour* DVD which was released in November.
- In March, the country entered national lockdown due to the Coronavirus pandemic. When Captain Tom Moore achieved his epic walk raising money for the NHS, Michael invited him on to his BBC Radio 2 Sunday morning show. This led to an appearance on BBC Breakfast News in which Michael thanked Captain Tom with a short rendition of 'You'll Never Walk Alone'. Within 24 hours they had recorded a single of this song which was ready for it's first broadcast on *The Zoe Ball Breakfast Show*. The single stormed to the top of the charts which led to Captain Tom being the oldest artist to achieve Number 1 and Michael finally achieving his first elusive Number 1 single.
- Michael kept very busy during the lockdown by regularly co hosting *The One Show* with Alex Jones on BBC One. Michael continued to host his weekly Sunday morning show *The Michael Ball Show* for BBC Radio 2 throughout the year including his popular 'Boogie with Ball' segment!
- In September Michael led the new cast of *Hairspray* in a rendition of 'You Can't Stop the Beat' for *Britain's Got Talent*. Michael returned to *Britain's Got Talent* a couple of weeks later to join the cast of *Les Misérables* to perform 'One Day More' for the Grand Final.
- Michael recorded his fourth album with Alfie Boe *Together at Christmas* which was released on 21st November and reached Number 1.
- Michael joined Alfie and the rest of the *Les Misérables* cast to return for a short Christmas season at The Sondheim Theatre to star as Javert in *Les Misérables*: The Staged Concert'.

WHAT'S NEXT?

From April through to August Michael will return to the role of Edna Turnblad in *Hairspray* which is having its London revival at the iconic Coliseum Theatre.

Michael and Alfie will close 2021 by taking part in another huge UK and Ireland arena tour promoting their latest album *Together At Christmas* including a final date at London's O2 Arena. I'm sure there will be a lot more to look forward to too!

DOING THE BOOGIE WITH BALL

During the lockdown, Fan Club member Janice Jenkinson posted videos of her son Mark, who enthusiastically took part in Michael's 'Boogie With Ball' segment on his radio show. Janice says Mark is autistic and was struggling with the lockdown but 'Boogie With Ball' gave him something to focus on. Not only that, the support Mark got from the Fan Club members boosted his confidence immensely, and he even got a chance to talk to Michael! Mark's Auntie Janet was good enough to type Mark's words up for this feature:

When my mam first told me about coronavirus I didn't fully understand it and I was very frightened about it and I was really worried about my mam. When we went into lockdown I was really scared. I didn't want to go out for a walk, I was scared we would walk past people who had it and we would get it.

My mam and me would always listen to Michael on Sunday morning and when he started 'Boogie With Ball' I said to my mam that I wanted to join in with it. It gave me something to do all week, as I would practice every day to try and get it right. Sometimes the dances were really hard but I didn't want to give up, I always wanted to do my best. I really enjoyed it and it took my mind off what was going on in the world outside. It made me feel so much better and was good exercise too.

My mam was telling my Auntie Janet in Hull about it and she suggested that my mam should write and tell Michael about how much he has helped me. My mam also put the video of me that she always sent to Auntie Janet on Michael's Fan Club page. I didn't know but Gill and Maureen, who run the Fan Club, had also decided Michael should know, so thanks to them as well! I was really shocked that Michael wanted to speak to me on the radio and I was so happy to be able to talk to him – it really made my day and my mam's as well!

I also now have hundreds of friends now on the Facebook page who comment on my dance every week. I read them all and answer them. Michael has the best fans in the world and I want to say thank you to them all.

Two weeks ago the worst thing happened. I got coronavirus, I was really poorly and was very frightened and scared, especially as my mam got it too. We had to look after each other and now we're feeling much better. We had loads of get well messages from everybody so thanks again.

I was too poorly to do last Sunday's dance, which was 'Tragedy', which upset me as it's one of my favourites.

My dream is that one day I could do Boogie with Ball with Michael at Wogan House. Maybe when this is all over I could!


PS they have still never been washed !!

After the show I tried my best to get my parents to wait at the stage door to meet Michael but it was a cold and wet night so I wasn't allowed. On returning home I immediately wrote to Michael at the theatre. He very kindly replied, sent me a signed photograph and the information on how to join his Fan Club, which I did straight away.

So whilst Michael moved to New York to star on Broadway, I sat my GCSE's and began my A Levels. Then along came university, with new found independence and public transport (especially the National Express). I found myself visiting various parts of the country seeing Michael. Since this time I have been extremely lucky to see every UK tour, every musical that he has appeared in, in the UK, the Fan Club events and many TV show recordings and record signings.

This leads me to one of my favourite memories of meeting Michael. It was at the HMV London record signing for One Careful Owner at the Trocadero entertainment complex in 1994. I left home around 5am to get to London in time with my friend Rachel (not a Michael fan but a very patient friend!). We queued for what seemed like days to meet Michael. I got a photo signed and had my picture taken with him and then had a quick chat before moving on. We then decided to wait until he had finished to wave him off, this involved sitting on the street for a few more hours until he left. The photo taken was fab and I was over the moon with it, we both had rather big hair but looked so happy. I sent the photo to the Fan Club and it was published in one of the old issues of On The Ball, which back then was a small black and white paper booklet. I was so chuffed that it got published and was even happier when Michael signed it after waiting for him at the stage door at Manchester

Apollo. I loved the photo so much that I had it saved in my purse, this was then signed by Michael whilst waiting for him at the stage door when he was starring in *Passion* in 1996 at the West End. I remember him commenting on how funny our hair was. The same signed photo, which now looks slightly worse for wear still sits proudly in my purse.

Being a Michael Ball fan for the last 31 years has been fantastic. I walked down the aisle to his singing (sadly not sung live), we played his music at both my parents funerals and put simply, his music is the soundtrack to my life. I have visited so many beautiful and wonderful places in the UK that I wouldn't have seen if it wasn't for following him, I have also met some truly lovely people.

My second photo is the most recent picture I had taken with Michael which was outside the Gielgud Theatre in London last year. My friend Kate is also on the photo; she is a massive Les *Mis* fan so was very excited to meet Michael.

I wanted some of my Michael memories and stories on paper as it's nice to share them with like-minded people. I have a garage full of Michael memorabilia including hundreds of photos and cuttings from a time before we had digital cameras, phones and easy access to everything on the internet. I am still often looked upon puzzlingly by people when I tell them I am a Michael Ball fan – back in 1990 he wasn't the average girls favourite pop star (you will all know what I mean) but at least now they know who he is without me having to try and explain! We are so lucky nowadays that he is visible on the TV, internet and radio so we can watch and listen to him regularly. 
